Second PlanItPompano! Community Workshop

The City of Pompano Beach, along with its consultant team, will be holding the second of the PlanItPompano! Community Workshop series for the public to provide input to help prepare the latest update of our Comprehensive Plan. After the first community workshop held on June 29th, the PlanItPompano! team has been working to prepare the data inventory, analysis and goals, and objectives and policies framework for each of the elements of the City's Comprehensive Plan.

The Comprehensive Plan or Comp Plan, as it is often referred to, is a long-range policy document that Florida State statutes require Pompano Beach and all other Florida local governments to maintain. But the Pompano Beach Comprehensive Plan is much more than that. The plan contains goals, objectives, and policies designed to ensure the orderly and balanced economic, social, physical, environmental and fiscal development of our City. The plan is the blueprint for the future development of our community.

The second workshop, scheduled for October 24th at the E. Pat Larkins Center, at 5:30 p.m., will focus on presenting and the plan elements in an interactive discussion format to finalize consensus on the City's future growth and development.

The workshop will be conducted as a series of conversation segments, each consisting of a brief presentation about a specific plan element topic followed by a small group discussion.

Registration starts at 5:30 p.m. The first presentation will begin at 5:45 p.m. and the event will end at approximately 7:30 pm. Refreshments will be served.

Florida statutes require that the Comp Plan be updated periodically. The entire process will take approximately a year and a half. The Comp Plan may be a long-range document, but it is also dynamic, evolving as community conditions, aspirations, opportunities and challenges change over time. And since the current plan was adopted back in 2010, a lot has changed in our City which the Comp Plan will need to address.
